The spring tour went very well and we thank the Lord for the mighty works he has wrought. This was our last chance to reach the students before the school year ended. I was grateful for the opportunity to train a number of Christians on this tour. They are all excited about ministering on campus now. What a blessing to have other saints join me when witnessing to students. I believe there was a total of around forty different Christians who joined me

on this tour. Amen! Thanks to everyone who took off from work, to work as laborers in God's great harvest!

Here are a few recent highlights in the ministry to campuses.



Norwalk Community College in Connecticut is where I started my spring tour. The Lord allowed me to take out two churches there at the same time. Praise God for His great blessing! It was very cold and was supposed to rain all that morning and throughout the day. I prayed the Lord God of Elijah would hold it off as we ministered. Because of the cold, my flesh did not want to be outside. I also knew it would be hard to gather a crowd of students in such weather so we

started off passing out tracts and witnessing in the corridor and hallways. After about 10 minutes the security said we could not be there but I showed them my federal lawsuit victory with SCCC and persuaded them otherwise. Unfortunately this was only temporary for we had trouble with the administration and security about 30 minutes later.



We continued to minister for probably about an hour and forty minutes outside until they figured out what to do with us. During this same time we ministered to this one female student who was suddenly panic-stricken. She had just got off the phone with her boy friend who told her he had tested positive for the Aids virus. I remind students constantly that statistics show that one in three people have a STD. There

is a high price for fornication. Because of God's perfect timing she heard the gospel and was prayed with that day. Thank God our Saviour's blood is virus free blood. Amen! Another student stood out in the breezy cold in shorts, t-shirt and flip-flops. He stood there with me for about 45 plus minutes as I shared God's word with him. Before I was finished sharing with him, there were about ten police officers on the scene. The devil hates the gospel. You can see at least 6 police cars in the picture below.



We finally were forced to leave the campus under threat of arrest for trespassing on public property. Just after we left the parking lot the Lord God of Elijah unleashed the rain. We were as dry as the valley of dry bones, Amen! Thank you Jesus!

SUNY Albany in New York told me I needed to fill out forms and have an insurance card. They wanted me to have liability insurance before they would let me come on campus. This was a

grievous infringement on our constitutional rights to say the least. With the help of God I went without it to test the waters. The police and administration watched me from 150 yards away while God parted the Red Sea, allowing me to preach without interruption. They decided not to cross the parted waters to persuade. Amen! It was a blessing to have a newly saved brother and his pastor join me that day. We passed out many gospel tracts and had a good crowd of students for the day with many powerful witnesses.

My heart had been burdened for Jefferson Community College for months now.



It was here where a student was troubled by his professors about his outspoken faith in Christ. They continually mocked his faith in the Bible and persuaded him to read the book, "God Delusion" by the ungodly atheist Richard Dawkins. He says, "It's wicked to teach

children about God and the Bible." This young student was so troubled by the enemy through this book and his professors that he sadly took a pistol to himself ending his life. I wish I could have preached here before hand. I like what his father told the news media. He said, "*If my son was a professing homosexual, and a professor challenged him to read a book called 'Preventing Homosexuality'... If my son was gay and the book made him feel bad, hopeless so that he killed himself, and that came out in the press, there would be an outcry. He would have been a victim of a hate crime and the professor would have been forced to undergo sensitivity training, and there may have even been a wrongful death lawsuit. But because he's a Christian, I don't even get a return telephone call.*" I've been able to witness to students who have gone through this same trying moment in their life. While at Jefferson there was a Muslim teacher who came out to confront me. The Lord allowed her to see that faith vs. works was what separated us. She said, "I need to learn more about this forgiveness by faith." I had a catholic

professor that came out to speak with me for about 30 minutes. He even brought us some cookies and water. I had a good witness with him as well. A student named Kurt came up and shook my hand and thanked me before he had to leave for class. He came back two other times and then at the end we talked one on one as I shared the gospel with him again. I believe he is very close to trusting Christ if he hasn't by now. I preached for a solid 6 hours with a crowd the whole time but had to leave early due to church that night. This is definitely an open campus with lots of opportunities even though it is very small.



While preaching on evolution at Binghamton State University I stated no one knows how old fossils are when you dig them up. It can only be a general guess, but you can't say it is 1 million years old etc.

The students shouted we know how old fossils are because of the date of the layers of dirt they are found in. I grabbed a handful of dirt from the side and put it in front of the gathered crowd. I said, "Tell me how old this is." The look of shock was on their faces. "Tell me how old that dirt is", I repeated. How foolish to think you can put a date on how old dirt is unless you have the Maker tell you.

This is all that space allows for but we had other amazing witnesses at, Western Connecticut State University, SUNY New Paltz, Schenectady County Community College, Onondaga Community College, Adirondack Community College and SUNY College at Potsdam, NY.

Also, I will be working on having more tools for students on our website and printing a few new tracts specifically for student. Finally, the Attorney General's office accepted our application for the lemon law violation of our RV. Gulf Stream is in violation on several accounts so we should win hands down. However, the law is never simple so prayer that the Arbitrator would rule in our favor. If we win they'll have to give us a full refund. Please keep these matters in prayer.
