This is a picture of a student named David at who trusted Christ during my outreach to Pasco-Hernando County Community College in FL. I had not planned on going to this campus originally. During this time I had severe pain in my neck and arms. I could not find a chiropractor in the area I was staying so I headed to a Christian



chiropractor who was about

an hour away. He had worked on me over 6 years ago when I was in the area preaching there. Little did I know that the Lord would send me there to reach David. Amen!

While at the University in Knoxville, Tennessee a student named Justin and I talked for an hour and a half about the Bible. We had revival services that week and he brought two friends to church with him. It's always encouraging to see someone come to church when they say they will. So many people promise to come to church but often do not.

At UT I witnessed to an oriental student named Ben. It was his last day on campus



for the year. Despite it being his first year when most students usually leave school losing faith in God, Ben left trusting in Christ. Amen! He has since called me and told me that next year he will have a car and would like to come to church with me.

About a year and a half ago I received a phone call from a brother named Craig who had gotten saved recently. He

heard about me through his boss at work. His boss mentioned he was upset because he read in the news paper that I had been falsely arrested at SCCC. Craig later trusted Christ and decided to



pass out tracts at Hudson Valley County Community College in Troy, NY where he was attending. Sadly, he was told by the administration that he was not allowed to preach or pass out tracts on campus. Because of this he searched the internet to locate and contact me for help. I invited him to go with me to the University of Albany in NY to help teach him how to minister on campus. I told him I would come back and make a stand at HVCCC. I did this recently and the following is a brief account of what took place.

I began to preach and within minutes there was a crowd of 400 plus students gathered. Unfortunately, right as the crowd was building a couple students got on their cell phones complaining to the campus. Before long an officer approached me and pushed me and my camera



saying in a raised voice, “turn it off you can’t be here!” Trying to calm him down I said, “Sir my name is Greg and you are?” I began to



explain why I was there and that it was perfectly lawful. He said that unless I was a student, teacher or faculty staff I had to leave campus. I pulled out my court order to which he said he didn’t care what the federal court said. Things were not going well. I asked them what law I was breaking. There was a second officer who said I was disturbing the peace which he said was against the law. He stated that the people did not want to hear me and therefore I had to leave. I respectfully disagreed with him and said, “If they do not want to hear me they can simply walk away.” I then began to read my court decision to them. In hearing this, the second officer called someone who informed him that there was a dean who might give me permission. I asked for his number. The officer said he didn’t have it but that I could walk across campus to the office. I told him if I leave now to walk across campus I would lose my congregation and the students want to hear

me. When I said that the students cried, “Yes, we want to hear him, he has a right to be here and we want to hear him!” Many of them lifted their hands in the air signifying how many wanted to hear me. With that I said, “It’s their campus, sorry I must preach. I have a right to freedom of assembly and they want to hear me. With that said they agreed and walked away and when they did the students cheered. Amen, thank you Jesus! *“The king’s heart is in the hand of the LORD, as the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will.” (Prov. 21:1)*

I then preached for five hours straight and had a circle of students around me the whole time. There are just too many wonderful stories that happened that day to tell you about, but many lives were changed and the students asked me to come back next year. To God be the glory!

I was contacted by another brother named Josiah who wanted to learn how to reach the colleges in his area in NC. During and since my outreach with him there have been several students that have made professions of faith in Christ.

Our Josiah turned three on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and he now has 6 Bible verses memorized and loves to preach on campus. I
