Dear faithful in Christ

Praise the Lord! Since the winter break at the end January I traveled to all but two of the major universities in FL. I still do not have a replacement video camera since the city of Schenectady had sent mine back broken. However, all of these universities are a no hassle open forum. I did not see one campus officer the entire time. Amen! Here are some of the highlights from Florida as well as two Georgia campuses.

I had two brethren join me at the University of South Florida in Tampa. It was the usual campus preaching and witnessing the whole time. One particular student said he did not believe the Bible and that it

was full of errors. He stated it was written by man and therefore fallible. I always find it humorous how it never occurs to them that they do not apply that same standard to their text books. They “know” evolution to be “true” because they have seen and read the evidence in their infallible text books. Thankfully the Lord allowed me to persuade this student otherwise and to see some fruit budding from our efforts there. Before he left he told me that he was going to get a King James Bible and read it from cover to cover. Amen! He even came back later and reaffirmed this to me while asking me other questions. Please pray that the Lord will open his understanding as he reads so that he might trust Christ. There are a number of foreign students who attend here. I had a long witness with one French student.



Although she was Catholic and remained blinded after showing her the way of salvation, it was

a pleasure to deal with her compared to a typical American student. At the University of North Florida in Jacksonville it was not the typical day. I ministered to a small group of Christian students and university employees while there. They continued to ask me one Bible doctrine after the next. It was great to see their thirst for the truth. They were very excited about my ministry and said they wanted to join me in my efforts to the lost students the next time I come to preach there. Typically the “Christian” students will condemn me for preaching and tell me, “This is not the way to do it.” I usually explain to them that God has “chosen” the foolishness of preaching along with the other verses in the Bible. While at the UNFJ one of these undercover Christians did just that. He told me he brings people to Christ by the way he lives. I asked him, “How many people have come to Christ because they saw the way you were living?” He told me, “none.” The devil sure has people fooled doesn’t he? We need to live right but also tell them. “...how shall they hear without a preacher?” (Romans 10:15) This new school year has brought me many new Christians who I have been in contact with on a

regular basis to help encourage. Praise God!

We traveled to the Heritage Boys Academy, and the Lighthouse girl's home while in FL. What a blessing to be able to preach to these troubled youths. They are getting educated toward the things of God while college students learn about the lies of the devil. Please pray for Hanibal and Maria. I didn't learn till after that they were wealthy and both attorneys. He clutched my tract in his hand and admitted he was going to hell. She is still trusting in her works. Please pray for them.

I had brethren from two churches join me while preaching at Florida State University. We had a good crowd and one full-time homosexual heckler who skipped all his classes to protest.
